SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR MIDWEST OPERATING ENGINEERS WELFARE FUND

This is a summary of the annual report for Midwest Operating Engineers Welfare Fund, EIN 36-6109395, for the year ended March 31, 2023. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefit Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Board of Trustees of Midwest Operating Engineers Welfare Fund has committed itself to pay all claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has a contract with Reliastar Life Insurance Company to pay life claims. The total premiums paid for the policy period ending March 31, 2023 was \$914,862.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan was \$706,924,568 as of March 31, 2023 compared to \$685,347,676 as of April 1, 2022. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$21,576,892. This increase included unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$375,829,304 including (but not limited to) employer contributions of \$335,394,742, participant contributions of \$33,356,597, realized losses of \$9,676,436 from the sale of assets and losses from investments of \$17,542,635.

Plan expenses were \$335,429,841. These expenses included \$20,121,987 in administrative expenses and \$315,307,854 in benefits paid to or for participants and beneficiaries.
